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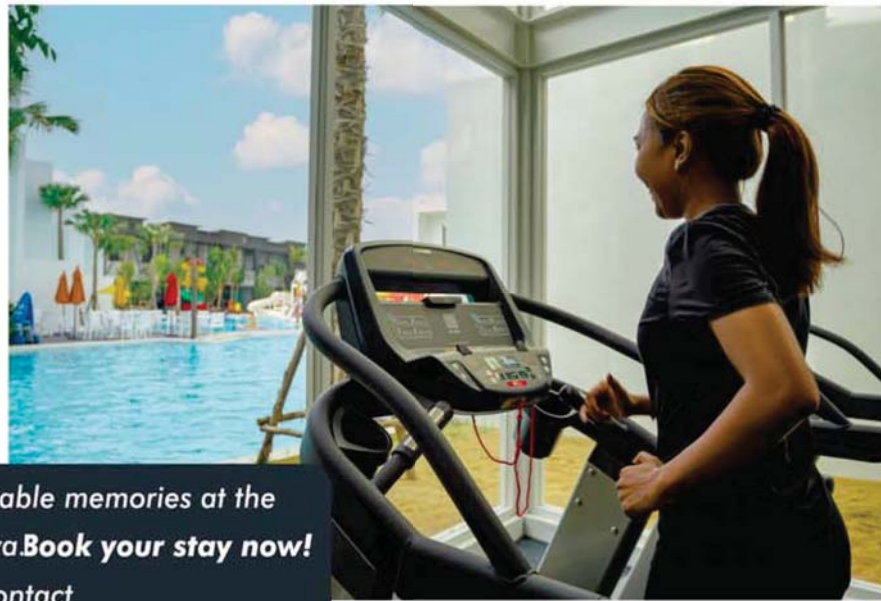
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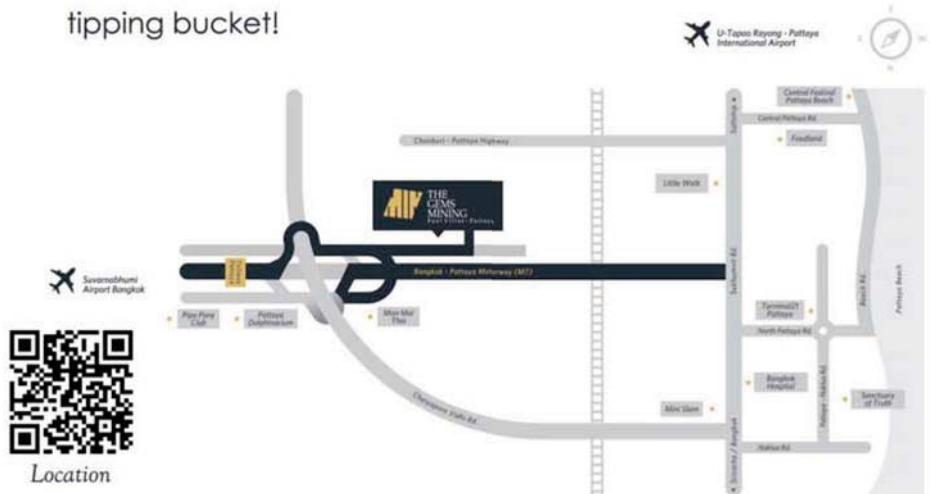

Are you ready for this?

After a couple of years during the pandemic when the Thai new year celebrations were put on hold, you can be sure that Songkran will return with a vengeance this year. It looks very much like the festivities will start around the 13th of April and will certainly go through until the “official” Pattaya Songkran day, which is the 19th. The return of the madness will bring a mixed reaction I’m sure and the dividing line normally is that the longer you have been here, the less enthusiastic you are.



The exodus of some of the Thai population in the city to return to their home villages and celebrate with their families will ensure the shutdown of many businesses and the influx of thousands of holidaymakers who will arrive with the express purpose of drinking as much as possible whilst throwing water over everyone in sight on the streets of the city will have the long term expats running for cover, both figuratively and literally!



The major attraction over the holiday is the massive music festival, Rolling Loud, being held at the new “Legend Siam” attraction in Na Jomtien. This is probably the biggest event ever put together in Thailand and even an old man like myself has heard of the headliners. I have no idea what size the crowds will be but a minimum of 20,000 plus revellers is expected, with the possibility of an actual figure some way North of that. This is the first time the Rolling Loud hip-hop festival has ventured into Asia after the cancellation of the original event in Hong Kong due to the pandemic in 2019.

This really is some logistical task that the authorities in Pattaya have taken on and it will be interesting to see how they cope and what effect that will have on any future plans to bring major events to Pattaya, and indeed Thailand. This is not a festival where people will be attending and staying at the site, so we have the prospect of not only a massive influx of people seeking accommodation for the three days but those same people travelling back to that accommodation, probably in the early hours of the morning. It's hard to imagine how the city's transport infrastructure will cope with such a task, especially given the fact that Pattaya will be extremely busy with Songkran revellers anyway.



I have seen many Songkran festivals in Pattaya over the years but I don't think anybody knows what to expect this time. Hopefully the powers that be are not in the same position and plans are in place to at least make sure the city doesn't come to a standstill. Perhaps the more cynical amongst you may think that things may not go too well, after some of the previous efforts by the authorities. I couldn't possibly comment but we can hope for the best.

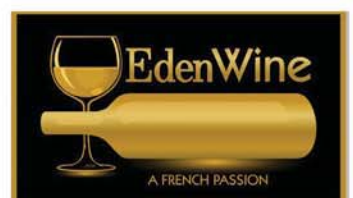
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A WARM WELCOME AWAITS YOU AT BRUNO'S

For those of us who have lived in Pattaya for some time, Anders, or Andy, as he is known to many, is a recognised host on the city's dining scene. Previously at News Restaurants, his TV commercial always started with a resounding "Welcome", and he was well known for being able to make a great Margarita.

Now Anders and his team at Thappraya Road will ensure you have a warm welcome and fantastic food when you step inside Bruno's. The recently reopened restaurant and wine bar is already making quite a name for itself with tremendous value 2-for-1 evenings and Sunday buffets, but we were there to discover the full evening experience.

So off to a great start our amuse bouche was a delicious serving of creamy potato salad - someone must have said this is my favourite guilty pleasure! Then we tried a Margarita - just to check if it was still as good and yes, I can confirm that the mixologist at Bruno's makes a great Margarita. We also tried a beautifully refreshing "Purple Rain" one of the signature cocktails containing vodka, lime and berries - highly recommended if like me, you prefer your cocktails not sweet but zesty and well blended.

The ambience inside Bruno's is excellent. Glass partitioned, it has a cocktail bar in front of the perfectly lit dining area. Then, alongside an impressive wine cellar, there is a separate dining room ideal for parties. Anders told me they had hosted a large gathering the night before where guests decided to select and share 2 of everything on the menu!

Unobtrusive staff stay back at the edge of the room but diligently come to your table as soon as they see that service is required. This is an often overlooked skill but bad staff who hover, snatch plates away or leave diners unattended too long can be a serious setback to a fine dining experience. At Bruno's, Anders and his team have the balance exactly right.



So what about the food? Well as appetisers we decided to try the Beef Carpaccio and Lobster Bisque. The carpaccio was a pleasingly generous portion and the soup thick and creamy containing plenty of lobster meat.

We then shared a prawn, avocado and macadamia salad and although disappointed that there wasn't much evidence of macadamia, were pleased by the delicious inclusion of tender pieces of peach.

For the main event, we decided on Duck with an orange sauce and Pork Cordon Blue. The duck was succulent, had no fat, was perfectly pink in the middle and cut to just the right thickness.

The pork was served with carrot batons, chips and mange tout and was accompanied by a dark fruity gravy.

Just before dessert, we saw Anders doing the rounds of the tables checking that all was well and getting comments and opinions from his diners.

He insisted we try the desserts and so we opted for a beautifully presented creme brulee with mandarin and strawberry segments and a fresh, tangy raspberry sorbet with vanilla ice cream.

If you've yet to visit Bruno's, its on Thappraya road, Jomtien, one of Pattaya's very best dining streets and there is plenty of parking at the side.

Of course, every type of fresh seafood was being served, which was highly praised by the shellfish and sushi lovers amongst us, but it was the variety of dishes through the whole range that was impressive. We even had a non-seafood eater amongst us but there was no complaints from them after seeing the meat dishes and charcuterie being offered, not to mention a wonderful array of dessert choices, accompanied by a chocolate fountain! Sitting in the restaurant looking out over the excellent family pool and onto the beach, it was certainly a memorable evening.

Another venue where we were bowled over by the food and the setting was the beach club at The Pullman Pattaya. We decided on the “Grazing Board” for four people, which you have served to you whilst lazing on a bed looking out over the beach.

The quality and variety was excellent and was more than enough to satisfy the whole party. We also sampled the seafood buffet that is served every Friday and Saturday evening and this was another high quality offering, again not just for seafood lovers.



One of the restaurants we have been visiting for years now is Marco's on Thappraya Road, and over all that time I doubt the food has ever let us down. Our latest meal there was as good as ever and the quality of the food, the excellent staff and the attention to detail from Marco himself has made this one of the busiest and best loved eateries in the city.

The choices are continuously updated, with a new variety of pizza every month, and with the addition of various Thai infused dishes the menu has been given an added twist.

Speaking of Thai food, I find it impossible to recommend anywhere in particular as everywhere I go I enjoy! The quality of the local food is really something and this is what I believe makes Pattaya extraordinary in its choice of places to eat. No matter what budget you are on, you can find something to suit you and being able to mix up the more upmarket international food with some of the local offerings make eating out in Pattaya a continuous pleasure.



You can rest assured that like us, many of the long term residents here will have there “go to” places where the food is always good and the prices don’t break the bank, and finding a new one is always a pleasure. It really is good to see the big hotels, bars, restaurants and local businesses busy again and with Songkran officially back in full swing I think Pattaya can look forward to a much improved 2023.

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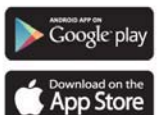

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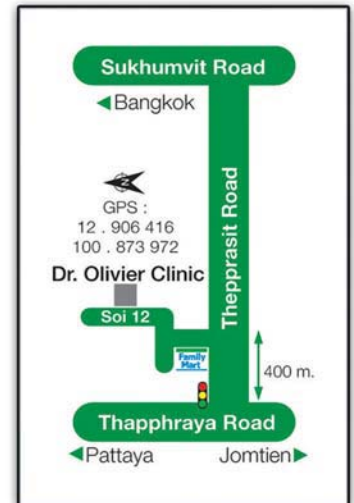
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APRIL SPORTS UPDATE

This month continues the great list of events that sports fans have to look forward to and top of the list is the playing of the first golf "major" of the year, the Masters at Augusta National.

The only major to be played at the same venue every year, the field will be packed with the best players in the world and is certainly most golf fans idea of a "must see" event on TV, in spite of the horrendous time difference for us locals!



At the top Arsenal are five points clear of Manchester City at time of writing after having a mid season wobble and these two look likely to fight it out for the title, although Manchester United are in a rich vein of form and if both of the top two stumble, they will be there to pick up the pieces.

The World Snooker Championship starts on the 15th, with the final being played on its traditional day, Mayday bank holiday in the UK which this year is actually falling on Monday the 1st of May.



The Premier League has a packed programme throughout the month and every weekend has a full fixture list, not to mention some extra midweek matches. There will only be around four games left after April and the potential champion and relegation candidate issues will become much clearer afterwards.



F1 has two outings in April, with the Australian GP being run on the 2nd of the month and the Azerbaijan race taking place on the 30th.

THE LGPA HONDA CLASSIC 2023

It looks like Thailand has unearthed another female golf star in the shape of 20yr old Natthakritta Vongtaveelap, who made a huge impression on her tour debut at this year's LGPA Honda Classic, played as usual at the Soi Siam Country Club old course just outside Pattaya.

She had not gone unnoticed by some people here in Thailand, as she had been runner-up in the Asia-Pacific amateur tournament in both 2021 and 2022 and since turning professional recently had added a couple of wins on the local Thai Tour.

It turned out that one of those local wins had earned her an invitation to the LGPA Honda Classic, a Rolex event and one of the premier tournaments on the LGPA schedule. The field was stacked with great players, including four of the current top five in the world and this was a baptism of fire on the big stage for her first LGPA event.

Having played some beautiful golf over the first three days, Natthakritta found herself in the position of going out last with a four shot lead on the final Sunday of the event and playing alongside her childhood friend and current world number four, Atthaya Thitikul, must have been a welcome bonus as the nerves started to jangle!

It wouldn't be fair to say that she gave the tournament away from the position she was in as it took a last round 64, the best of the day, from American Lilia Vu who started six shots back, to win the tournament by a single shot.



However, her round of 71 was the worst in the top 25 on the day, a perfectly understandable performance given it was her first full professional appearance. Her outright second place finish with a final score of 267, 21 under par, which earned her over 150,000 US dollars, was a great achievement playing amongst the world's elite.

I think Thailand has found a new top quality player here to go alongside many others that have come through over recent years. If you're a golf fan do try to get along to the LGPA Honda Classic next year, it really is a chance to see some of the best players in the world close up on a magnificent golf course and really should be supported.





ARE RED BULL SET TO DOMINATE F1 IN 2023?

The 2023 F1 season has started with a dominant performance by Red Bull in Bahrain where Max Verstappen, the number one driver, beat his team mate Sergio Perez by 11 seconds with the rest well beaten off. George Russell, who drives for Mercedes, has publicly declared that Red Bull "have the title sewn up" and continued "I don't think anyone is going to be fighting with them this year. I expect they will win every single race this season". A sad state of affairs for Mercedes, the other teams involved and the millions of F1 fans around the globe.

One glimmer of hope that has been partially dashed already by the Bahrain result is the fact that Red Bull have a 10% wind tunnel time penalty for a breach of the cost cap on top of the already limited time they have available after winning the title last year.

to test the car in conditions similar to the actual race in the wind tunnel is strictly regulated by the powers that be and because of the restrictions on Red Bull it may be that the other team's car development through the season develops better. Although if you believe the book-making industry, this is a faint chance indeed.





There are some interesting things happening in the coming F1 season, in spite of the overwhelming superiority of Red Bull. A record number of 23 races are set to be run and that would have been 24 until the cancellation of the Chinese race and the decision not to replace it. However, the real talking point of the season will be the first staging of the Las Vegas Grand Prix in November. This is really ambitious stuff from both the city and the F1 organisers and it looks like the Vegas edition of F1 is trying to become the main attraction on the calendar. A massive paddock is being constructed in the city and the course itself will include the famous "Vegas strip" as the main straight, creating a spectacle that few, if any, sports can match.

The USA is staging three races this year including the usual leg at the "home" of F1 in the States, Austin Texas. Miami is the third venue and this year's race will be the second of a ten-year contract. One amazing innovation for the race is that the paddock is going to be built inside the Hard Rock Stadium, with spectators allowed in to watch the whole thing from the stands. Incredible stuff.

So there we have it. A season that looks likely to be a lap of honour for Red Bull and Verstappen, unless something goes horribly wrong. Let's hope the other teams can close the gap as the year progresses but whatever happens, you can be sure that F1 will throw up some surprises and plenty of thrills and spills.

At the 63rd Fort Lauderdale International Boat Show Jeanneau's Merry Fisher 1295 Fly earned a nomination in the Best of Show awards. There are a host of new features that clearly separate it from the former series flagship. Firstly, it has three engines, not two, while the flybridge has a full seating area for up to five guests.

The foredeck is a properly developed social area with integrated sun loungers and it has almost 47 per cent more fuel, giving another indication of the step up in scale.

Equipped with triple 300hp Yamaha outboard engines, the Merry Fisher 1295 Fly looks powerful, sleek and modern. It provides more space for entertaining family, friends and guests can also serve as a dedicated spot for sunbathing or reading, and is the best place for jumping into the water.

Whether it's taking a nap under the sun or sitting there watching family members or friends swim, paddleboard or kayak, this is an ideal spot.

The model features Groupe Beneteau's Seanapps technology, which has been included on all new Jeanneau yachts since September 2021. The system allows the owner to monitor data about the yacht through a smartphone app. They include safety information such as the GPS position, battery level, tank levels, bilge levels and engine data; trip information such as distance covered, speeds and depth; as well as temperature and humidity inside.

There are also options to install tropical-strength air-conditioning (36,000 BTU), yet another reason why the new series flagship could prove popular in Asia.

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SETTING-UP A COMPANY IN THAILAND

The most common structure and ideal initial step in starting a new business in Thailand is a Thai Limited Company. A limited company is that kind formed with a capital divided into equal shares. The shareholders' liability is limited to the amount of, if any, unpaid shares held by them.

COMPANY STRUCTURE

The structure of a Thai company has to consist of 1 or more director and a minimum of 2 shareholders. In Thai Limited Company shareholding, the company must be majority owned by Thais. This means that foreign ownership of the company cannot be more than 49%. Foreigners can hold 100% ownership of businesses in non-restricted categories, such as exporting businesses and certain types of manufacturing businesses. Other methods to obtain 100% non-Thai control are through application for an alien business license or Board of Investment (BOI) Promotion.

CAPITAL

A limited company in Thailand can be set up with only a few thousand Baht; however, the average declared capital is 1M Baht. Should the company intend to employ foreigners who are required to secure a work permit; the company must have a minimum paid up capital of 2 Million Baht for every foreign employee.

REQUIREMENTS

Reserving your desired company name is the first step and prerequisite in the establishment of a Thai limited company.

The proposed name shall be approved upon confirmation that it is distinct from any other registered company names. Your company will also need a registered office address in Thailand. This will determine what relevant government agencies you should be interacting with. Registered business address is also necessary before the company can apply for a Tax Registration Number.

All companies in Thailand have to be registered for tax purposes and must obtain a company income tax identity card from the Revenue Department within 60 days of incorporation or start of operation. Same as all other business forms, once established, a limited company must also follow accounting procedures specified in the Revenue, Civil and Commercial Code. Companies are required to file their audited financial statements once a year with the Department of Business Development and the Revenue Department.

LEGAL ASSISTANCE

Starting a new business in Thailand may become challenging due to language barriers and may take several days to complete the entire process. Because all legal documents are written in Thai, filling out these forms without understanding their contents or Thailand Law might result in major challenges and other issues that will have an impact on you and your business. In order to get comprehensive guidance and advise on how your company should be established, it is crucial to look for reputable lawyers and consultants with legal qualifications and real-world experience.

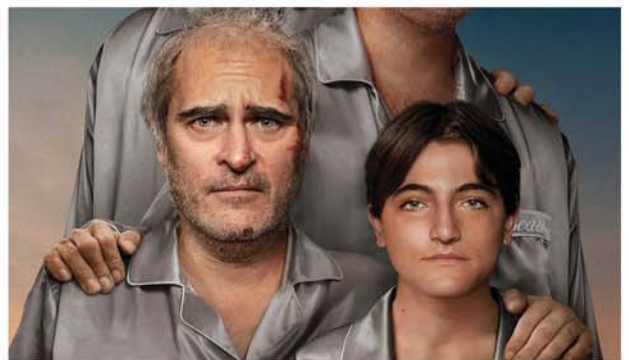

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BARRY UPTON - GONE COUNTRY

After being a top U.K. nightclub DJ/presenter and producing a fair amount of dance music in the late 80s, the early 90s presented a new challenge for me. The onset of Rave and Electro music wasn't my cup of tea and when the fun went out of being a personality DJ, being asked by club owners to just shut up and mix two identical tracks together, I decided to look elsewhere for fulfillment.

So, whilst driving on a vacation to Florida U.S.A., I tuned into a New Country radio station and loved everything they played. The songwriting was pure and melodic with tracks crossing over into rock, soul and pop. This was right up my street so I returned to the U.K. armed with a plethora of recorded cassette tapes I'd gleaned from the K92.3 local Orlando radio station.

In my career up to this point, I'd touched on the country music genre in writing sessions with my mentor and Brotherhood Of Man manager Tony Hiller who'd written countless melodic hits, so I knew a bit about how to write a country song and had, indeed had a few chart hits myself at this point.

However, on regular visits to country capitol Nashville, it was like starting again as songwriters I was paired up with taught me new lessons in the art of lyric writing. I gratefully grasped at the opportunities offered and tirelessly worked at producing good modern country rock/pop tracks.

The biggest problem though was that U.S. artists already had their regular songwriters, many composing their own tracks so opportunities were limited. I smooched with many top country artists at that time including Shania Twain but came to a dead end as, like her, they were already overloaded with great songs.

However, in the U.K. and the rest of the world, the popularity of New Country music was spreading together with the rise of Line Dancing which in the late 90s became the second most popular U.K. pastime (Bingo was the 1st).

So it was that I became one of the only U.K. music producers to be providing tracks for Line Dance compilation albums and actually received a silver disc for the No. 1 Line Dance album alongside many hits from the U.S.A.

The next step was to get onto CMT which was an MTV for country fans (Country Music TV). I played some of my songs to one of CMT's producers in Nashville and a couple of tracks were chosen. I made the videos and, lo and behold to my amazement, became a HOT SHOT and was played almost every hour. This was a big achievement and considerably elevated my status as a New Country artist/songwriter.

Check out on YouTube: 'Hey, You On The Radio' and 'I'm Still Falling', both from 1997.

Around this time, many people were suggesting to me I write a commercial pop Line Dancing song. After some serious head scratching, I came up with the now worldwide classic hit 5,6,7,8 and the rest is history.

So, that's the story of my 'Gone Country' years in the 90s.

It was pure joy for me to be asked last month to perform a New Country Line Dancing set at Sandbar by the Sea on Dongtan Beach, Pattaya and rekindle the music from that time. Like the Beatles and 60s music, all these songs have retained their popularity and are a refreshing change from the banality of much of today's new music.

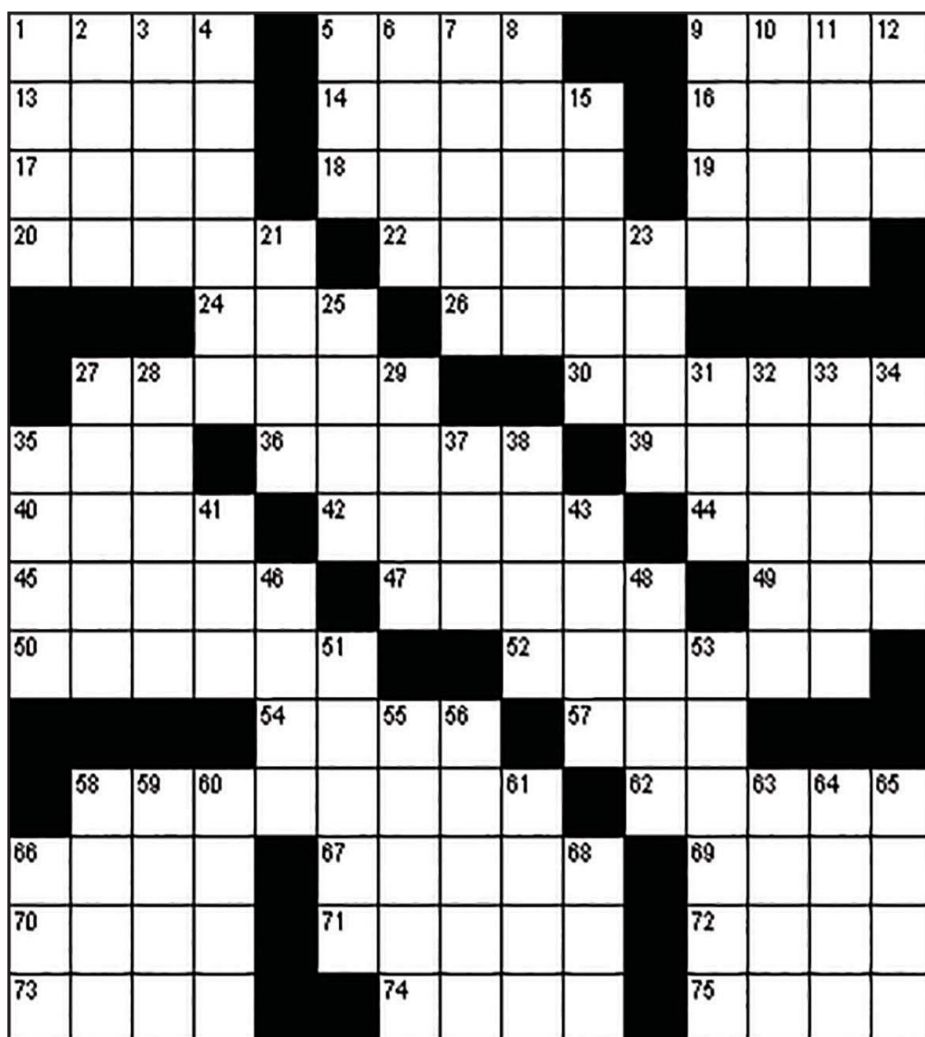

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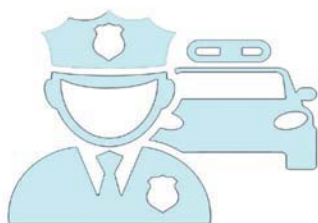

We followed the coast road south to Thong Krut Pier for a wonderful noodle breakfast where we were talked into a boat excursion to the nearby Ko Mat Sum and Tean Islands. The ferry cost just THB.550 for the car and 1 passenger and we were positively surprised with the quality and cleanliness of the Seatran Ferry, even serving a reasonable, freshly made espresso!. It was a lovely crossing over the glass like sea.



To summarise, Koh Samui is a lovely island and I can see what many will go just for a few nights in one of the upscale resorts.

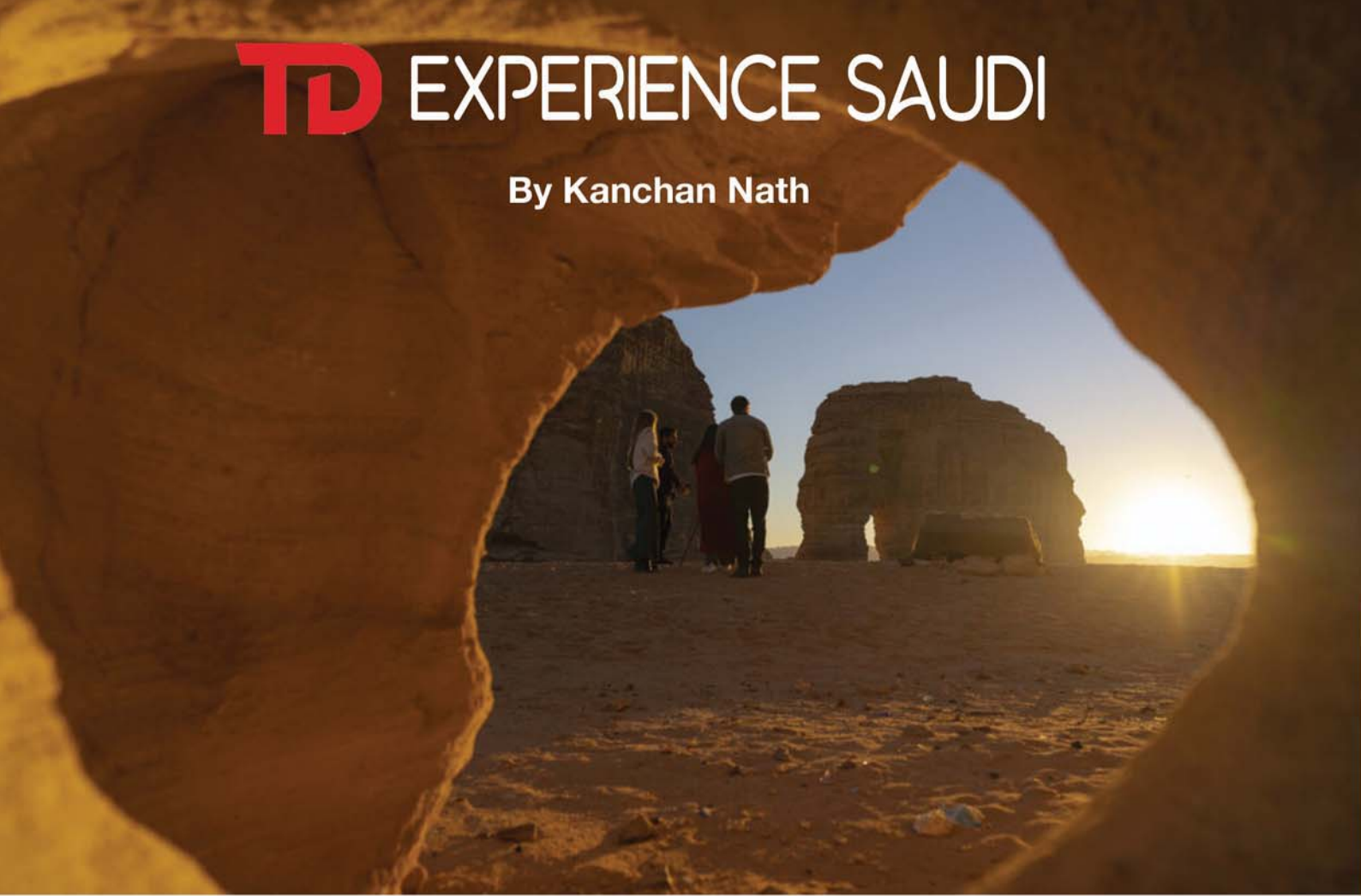

VISA AND PROPERTY

Karen would like to tell you about

What do tourists and foreigners who live long term in Thailand need to know.

I have working with foreigner in Thailand for many years and I have been working on the Visa Services for 25 years. Through all those years experiences, I have found that a lot of people did not know what to do when their visa expire and still want to stay longer in Thailand. Some people confuse what is TM 30, what is 90 days report ? and why they have to do visa run ? why can't they extend visa in Thailand? And some people even get so frustrate on extending visa.

So here are some answers that I can advice you.

1. TM 30 – Now that the government required everyone who enter Thailand, must do a report where they are staying. The owner of the residency must report if they are not report, you yourself must report where you stay. This report need to be done within 24 hours on the date you arrived.
2. Report 90 days – This report is for those who staying longer than 90 days or stay year by year. If you are on a year visa, you must do report every 90 days into immigration that you are still living in this address. You can report your 90 days 7 days before expire or after 7 days.
3. Visa Extention – To extend your visa, you can do it at immigration only one time than you need to leave Thailand. For those who want just to do visa run one day in-out you can do visa run to neighbour countries. There are so many others information to know which I can't give it all here. If you are not sure on your situations, you can bring your passport and visit me at my office for more informations.

1. ตม. 30 เป็นการรายงานที่พักเมื่อเดินทางมาถึงประเทศ ซึ่งปัจจุบันรัฐบาลขอให้ทุกคนที่เดินทางมาประเทศไทยต้องรายงาน การรายงานตม. 30 นี้ ปกติเจ้าบ้านต้องรายงานให้กับผู้ที่เข้ามาพัก หากเจ้าบ้านไม่ได้ทำ เจ้าตัวต้องทำเอง และการรายงานที่พักนี้ต้องรายงานภายใน 24 ชั่วโมง
2. การรายงานตัว 90 วัน อันนี้สำหรับคนที่อยู่เป็นปีหรืออยู่มากกว่า 90 วัน เป็นการรายงานตัวว่ายังอยู่และพักอยู่ที่นี้ ดังนั้นคนที่อยู่มากกว่า 90 วันในไทย ให้รายงานตัวกับตม. ทุกๆ 90 วัน
3. การต่อวีซ่า ในการต่อวีซ่า ต่างชาติสามารถต่อที่ตมได้หนึ่งครั้ง หลังจากนั้น ต้องออกจากประเทศไทยไป สำหรับผู้ที่จะไปต่อวีซ่าหรือทำวีซ่ารันชานแดนวันเดียว ก็สามารถไปประเทศเพื่อนบ้านได้

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What to know when converting a home into a home office

A commercial office space for some businesses may be necessary where they need space in which to operate but building or buying an office building often requires a large sum of money. Thus, turning a house into a home office becomes an attractive alternative as it can be more cost-effective.

Different types of houses can be turned into offices. Their limitations may depend on surrounding restrictions, for example lack of available parking spaces. In these cases a company may opt for one location in which to dispatch or receive supplies and a home office simply for preparation and storage of documents. Also most detached houses tend to be located in the suburbs, so more suitable when only 2-3 employees are on-site at the office.

When considering a house there may be other options to consider. For example, if your business is a start-up, buying or constructing a house may be too risky, so renting would be an option that uses less investment. If your company already has a fixed income and is financially stable, then buying is an attractive option especially if paying can be with a monthly mortgage loan. Businesses must prepare the following document to obtain a loan:

- A document stating that they have been in business for at least 2 years
- A bank statement for at least the last 6 months and commercial documents such as purchase and sales invoices, among others

Having a purpose built office would be suitable for those who want a specially designed home and office layout or their own land. These are documents that need to be prepared if you want to build a home office:

- Contact the contractor to design and agree on the price and construction contract. The contract usually specifies the conditions for reimbursement of construction costs in installments according to the progress of the construction.
- Apply for building permits from government agencies in the area, such as district offices, by bringing the plan layout to apply for a building permit.
- Apply for a loan with the bank; in addition to financial documents, other documents must be prepared, such as land layout, building contract, and construction permit.

Using a house as a home office can benefit the long run. Still, businesses should take into account various limitations according to the nature of the house, location, and business type. So, it is vital to be well-prepared and research information before finding your home office.

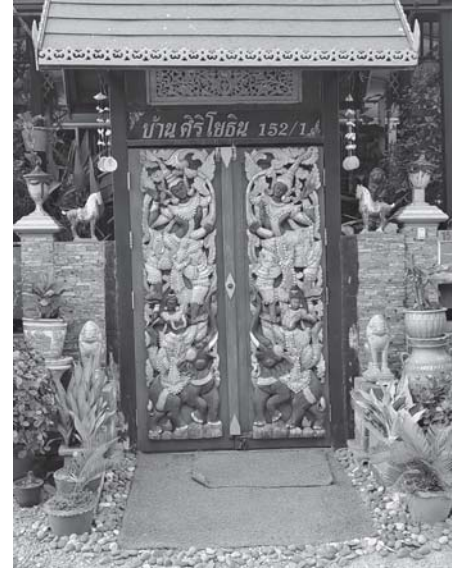
You need to be aware of the related Thai Laws that you must comply with such as Civil and Commercial Law as well as Taxation Law.

I hope this brief introduction will be beneficial for you to start your business in Thailand.

There are 4 basic things you should learn at the very beginning:

1. How to establish your juristic person as a corporation or limited partnership.
2. Taxation concerns such as National Taxes (Corporate Income Tax, Value Added Tax or VAT and other business taxes) and Local Taxes (Municipality Taxes).
3. Qualifications of a juristic person who is eligible to run any Thai business.
4. Qualifications of a person who can work in Thailand.

When choosing flowers, opt for those with strong stems. Also, those that tend to bloom for a long period of time. Good examples are daffodils, marigolds, roses and tulips. Find a spot for your cutting garden, maybe in a raised garden bed, easy for watering. Know your soil, is it dense and heavy and will clump together when wet or loose or is it free flowing with the consistency of sand? Clay soils have tiny, dense particles that hold large reserves of moisture and nutrients but drains slowly and can become hard and compacted when dry. Water will move through sandy soils more easily but so will important nutrients. Loam is the ideal soil for most plants being well balanced with mineral particles and rich in humus which is what's left after organic matter decomposes.

In locations where gardeners need to be drought conscious Mediterranean-style gardens are surging in popularity as this style is conducive to using less water. Lavender is one of several plants that serve to create the look of a Mediterranean garden as well as other fragrant herbs such as rosemary, oregano and basil. Plants such as Bougainvillea grow well and are bright climbers that will put on a show almost all year long and trees such as olive trees will help with the Mediterranean look.

If you don't have a garden you can still brighten your home with houseplants and although green is a classic the trend for indoor gardeners in 2023 is to choose something fun and different with foliage in surprising colours. For example, the Sun Red Philodendron as shown above with large leaves that produce eye-catching décor. Hydroponic varieties are also gaining in popularity because they can simply be grown in water so no soil is required. As long as you change the water at least once every couple of months, they are really easy to look after and very visually appealing especially when placed in a glass container, which puts the root system on display.



For many seasoned gardeners, foliage has always been a focus, but for others, recognizing all that foliage has to offer is opening a whole new world of possibilities. Look beyond just the variety of colours you can get from a plant's leaves and add foliage in a variety of textures to give depth and complexity. In their book *Fine Foliage*, Karen Chapman and Christina Salwitz write, "Without the contrast of different textures the composition will appear unexceptional." Here are some ways you can use texture in your garden:

Enhance the sense of touch. Whether it's walking on soft moss or running your hands along the tips of delicate stems of grasses, being able to touch and feel plants takes a garden experience to the next level. Also, make the most of the light and consider where the sunlight hits and how you can use it to your benefit to enrich visual interest.

If you are a keen gardener without too much space you can consider vertical gardening with the use of an arbour, trellis or pergola. Planter boxes and mounted containers work well to create "living walls".

Another popular garden trend this year is to use natural materials. There is an increased interest in creating calm, serene spaces which has led to a rise in the use of natural materials for hardscaping such as natural stone pathways. As landscape designer and horticulturist, Jan Johnsen puts it, "Rustic stone paths paved with small stones or stepping stones make us watch our step and slow our pace. They make us take time to appreciate the garden."

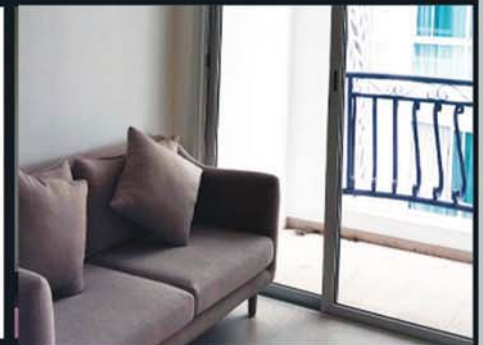
